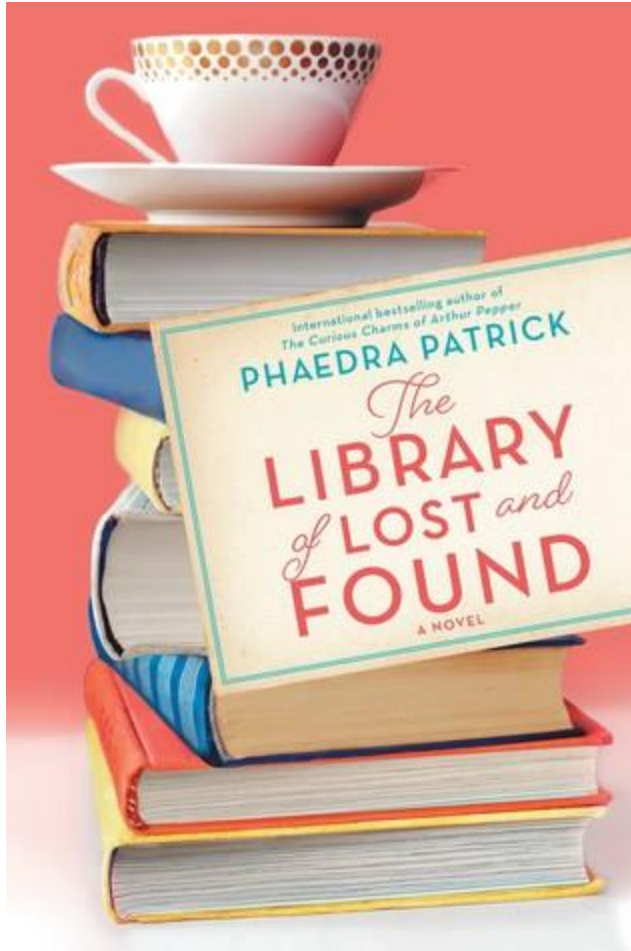


Books about Libraries and Librarians: Saturday Edition

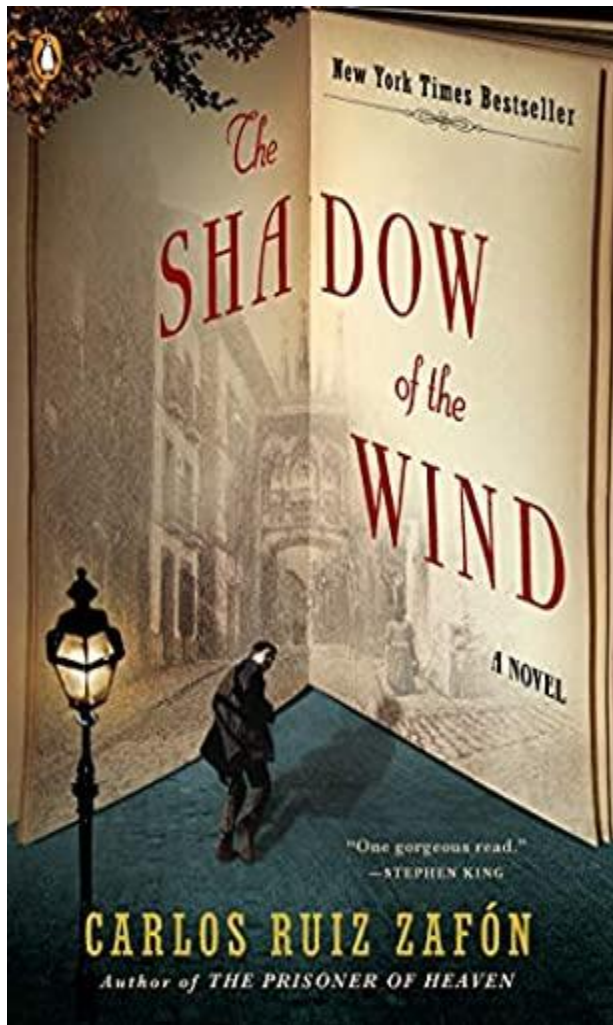

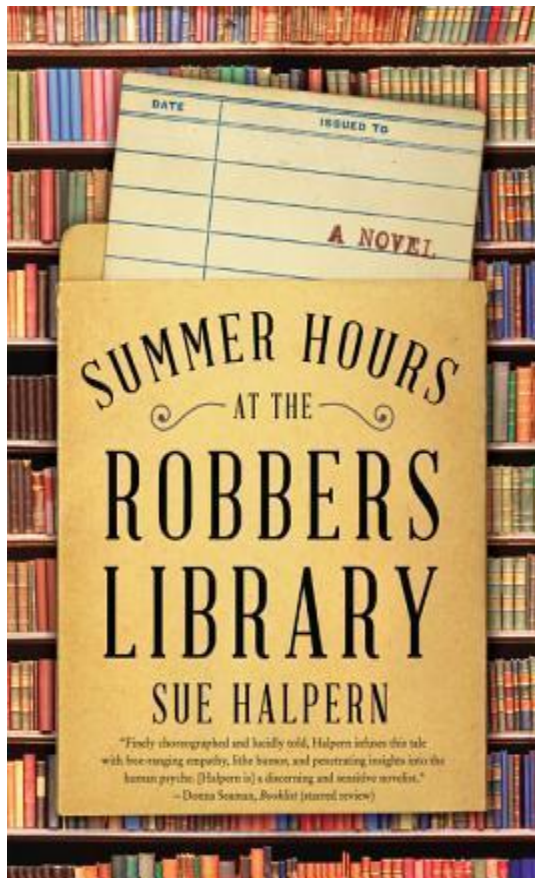
