

**We are so excited about our Color Adventure program! It is going to be messy, so we wanted you to have the need-to-know information to prepare you for this fun.**

**It is important to read this whole paper- the information is important for safety and to prevent unwanted stains in cars and on clothes.**

**Need to Know Info:**

1. There will not be bathrooms/changing rooms available.
2. The event is drop-in between the hours of 5-8pm. It should take between 20-30 minutes to complete the color stations. You need to arrive by 7:30 to participate. Because this event does involve going to different stations, there may be wait times.
3. Wear a white shirt to add fun colors. Wear a tank or other shirt underneath so you can take the colored shirt off at the end. Everything you wear that day will get color on it, so do not wear anything you are not okay with being colored. It will wash out of some clothes but know it is not guaranteed to wash out. (Shoes, undershirt, underclothes, shorts/pants- all items can get colored)
4. Bring an old towel to wipe off before leaving. Put an old towel/sheet/blanket on seats to protect them on the drive home.
5. The color will wash out of some items so if you do not want the shirt to remain colored, you should be able to wash color out. (From personal experience I can say it washed easily out of some clothes but not others so again, prepare for things to be stained but you can attempt to wash color out.) If you want the color to remain, we have instructions to help keep the color on shirts.
6. This program is for all ages but will be enjoyed most patrons 10 years and older.
7. If you signed up and can no longer attend, please adjust your reservation so the spot will be available for others.

**Safety:**

1. **Eyes will need to be covered. We will have sunglasses available, but they are adult standard size, if you or anyone in your care needs a smaller size, please bring sunglasses or safety glasses in their size. Eye covering will be required.**
2. **Keep your mouth closed when color is being used.**
